

### Application for Bonner Leader Program 2016 - 2017

Bonner Leaders are outstanding students who commit themselves to leadership through service and making positive changes across campus and in the community. This four-year service-based program pairs real-life work experiences in Charleston nonprofit organizations with powerful leadership development training and education that helps students transition from volunteers to leaders in their community. The first group of 7 Bonner Leaders began the program in September 2008; currently, there are 30 Bonner Leaders. Our program represents one of only a small handful of urban Bonner campuses in the country.

### Being a Bonner Leader means:

- Having a commitment to strengthening the community through service.
- Leadership development and opportunities.
- Organizing campus and community-wide service projects and events.
- Involvement in a community of peers dedicated to making a difference.
- Participating in national service conferences and other travel.
- Being open-minded and willing to work with diverse groups of people.

### **Requirements for Bonner Leader:**

- Commitment to a service placement and weekly meetings for 300 hours each year (10-12 hours/week).
- Complete 30 credit hours per academic year.
- Maintain a 2.7 CofC GPA.

### **Financial Package:**

- There is a scholarship for all Bonner Leaders who meet the above requirements.
- Bonner Leaders eligible for work study can be compensated through the work study program for their off-campus volunteering.
- All conference and training travel is covered by the program.
- The majority of domestic and international service immersion travel is covered by private donors.

- Why are you interested in the Bonner Leader Program, and what do you hope to gain from the program?
- What is one social, political, or economic issue that is important to you and why?
- What motivates you to keep a positive attitude and accomplish your goals?
- What does diversity mean to you? What will you bring to a diverse group? What do you hope to gain from a diverse group?
- What is your idea of "community"? Can service ever be selfless? Why or why not?
- Would you rather be a hammer or a nail? Why?
- Read the passage below and respond to the following question.

From: bell hooks, Teaching Critical Thinking, 2010

Thinking is an action. For all aspiring intellectuals, thoughts are the laboratory where one goes to pose questions and find answers, a place where visions of theory and praxis come together. The heartbeat of critical thinking is the longing to know-to understand how life works. Children are organically predisposed to be critical thinkers. Across the boundaries of race, class, gender, and circumstances, children come into the world of wonder and language consumed with desire for knowledge. Sometime they are so eager for knowledge that they become relentless interrogators-demanding to know the who, what, when, and why of life. Searching for answers they learn almost instinctively how to think.

Sadly, children's passion for thinking often ends when they encounter a world that seems to educate them for conformity and obedience only. Most children are taught early on that thinking is dangerous. Sadly, these children stop enjoying the process of thinking and start fearing the thinking mind. Whether in homes with parents who teach via model of discipline and punish that it is better to choose obedience over self-awareness and self-determination, or in schools where independent thinking is not acceptable behavior, most children in our nation learn to suppress the memory of thinking as a passionate, pleasurable activity.

- What does bell hooks say about the passion for learning? What do you agree or disagree with, and why?
- Is there anything else you would like the selection committee to know about you that you feel is not adequately reflected in your previous answers? Feel free to be creative.

- A resume with a list of service, school, religious, athletic, family, or work responsibilities to which you have been most committed (specify the activities, positions held and length/frequency of commitments).
- Two letters of recommendation which detail why you would be successful as a Bonner Leader and/or what you
  would most uniquely bring to the program. Please do not have friends or family provide these. Letters of
  recommendation should be mailed or emailed directly from the letter writer by the application deadline.
