ACTIVISM/COMMUNITY ORGANIZING: the process of involving, educating, and mobilizing individual or collective action to influence or persuade others

- Participating in a march to protest the Defense of Marriage Act
- · Organizing a sit-in of a university administrative building to combat tuition hikes
- Creating an art exhibit to raise awareness about human rights violations in U.S. Prisons

COMMUNITY-ENGAGED SCHOLARSHIP: connected or producing scholarship with public and/or private sector resources that responds to community-identified needs or concerns.

- Evaluating the impact and effectiveness of a new disciplinary policy at a local, public high school
- Enrolling in a patient advocacy program that combines coursework with field experience in a health clinic
