

**AS** incoming first-year students, Bonner Scholars make a four-year commitment to community engagement and social justice exploration, all while bringing sustained, reciprocal support to local organizations.

**Each year, approximately 25 students are selected to make a four-year commitment to being active citizens in the local Richmond community.** Bonner Scholars are matched with nonprofits, schools, and governmental agencies in the Richmond metro area that correspond with their interests in social issues and spend 10 hours a week engaging in meaningful work with increasing responsibility. These long-term, reciprocal partnerships lead students to become advocates and allies of the organization and bring consistent and thoughtful assistance to our communities.

In exchange for their work, Bonner Scholars receive a partial scholarship for full-time undergraduate study, as well as financial support for summer community work.
