If you are passionate about affecting positive change in the world, you may be a good candidate for one of Ursinus College's Service Leadership Programs: the Bonner Leaders and Scholars in Service. These competitive programs offer selected students with exceptional records of leadership, community service and/or social justice work an opportunity to continue their commitment to the common good. Bonner Leaders and Scholars in Service fulfill their service hours working in the community with local non-profits. Read on for descriptions of both of these programs:

--BONNER LEADERS OVERVIEW--

Annual Service Commitment: 300 hours

Average Volunteer Hours Per Week: 8-10

Annual Scholarship: \$4,000

The Bonner Program is designed to heighten the overall education students receive by asking them to engage in ongoing service work and helping them develop the experience, skills, knowledge and values necessary to make that work meaningful and lasting. In addition to community outreach, Bonner Leaders spend about two hours a week together as a group, reflecting on experiences and participating in training sessions to develop personal and leadership skills. This intensive, multi-year program is designed to enhance the students' academic experiences by fostering real-world, community connections.

The following is expected of Bonner Leaders:

- Make community service and leadership development one of their highest priorities
 - Maintain good academic standing
 - Perform a minimum of 300 hours of service during the school year by serving an average of 8-10 hours a week with a community partner(s)
 - Attend weekly Bonner classes as well as regularly scheduled events, individual meetings and advising sessions
 - Participate in a first-year service trip
 - Attend Bonner Orientation at the beginning of each semester
 - Attend Saturday Service Days once per month
 - Make a final presentation of learning
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--SCHOLARS IN SERVICE OVERVIEW--

Annual Service Commitment: 150 hours

Average Volunteer Hours Per Week: 4-6

Annual Scholarship: \$2,000

Scholars in Service to Pennsylvania is an initiative at Ursinus College that recognizes, trains, and supports students who are civically engaged. Students will pledge to complete 150 hours of service during the school year and, in exchange for that commitment, will receive leadership and organizing training, support from UCARE staff and fellow Scholars, and ongoing supervision and reflection activities.

Each Scholar will be expected to serve in a community organization for 4-6 hours per week and attend bi-weekly meetings/reflection sessions with the rest of the group (once every other week).

The following is expected of Scholars in Service:

- Perform a minimum of 150 hours of service during the school year by serving an average of 4-6 hours a week with a community partner(s)
- Attend bi-weekly group meetings
- Attend Saturday Service Days once per month
