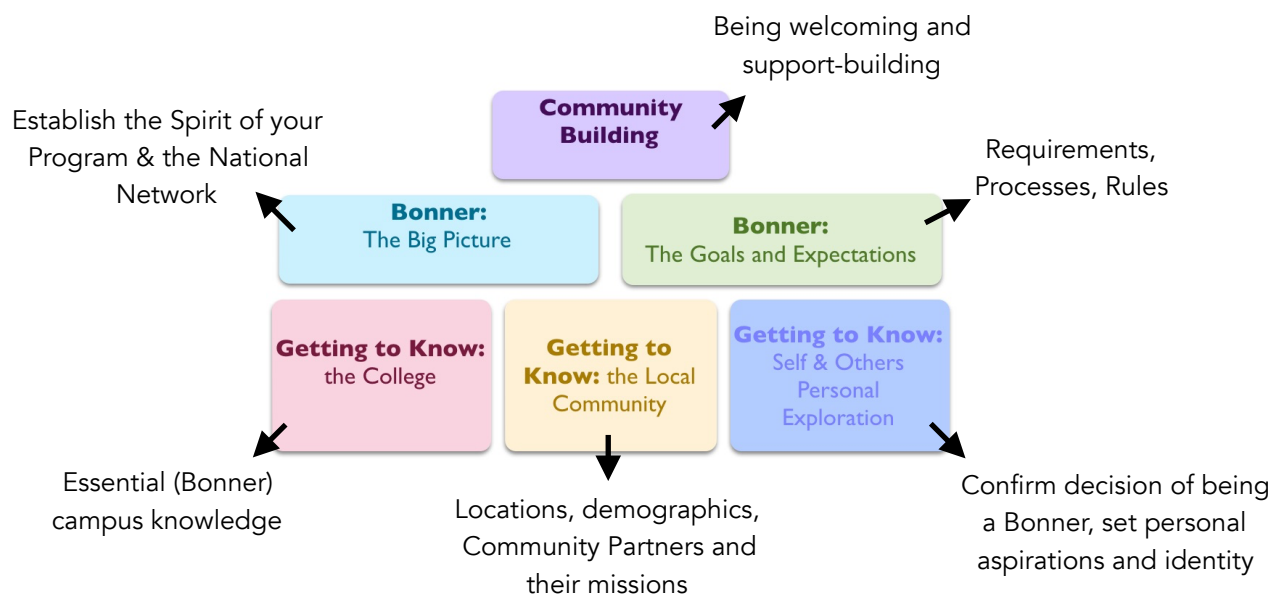

The Purpose of Orientation / Orientation Goals:

- Orientation is a vital aspect of someone’s Bonner experience because it provides the opportunities for::
 - establishing identity within the Bonner program,
 - gaining exposure to their Bonner community,
 - learning crucial aspects of the program (such as mission, values, logistical requirements,

Review - Components to a Good Orientation



Orientation Necessities: (More detail to the components)

- A brief orientation to the National Bonner Program and Network (where that fits in with the service movement in America) and national initiatives (transformational model and it's future; mission, and philosophy of the program)
- Logistics about program requirements (hours, fund allocations, probation details, rules of conduct, BWBRS, reporting structure, etc.)
- Team and Community Building (opportunities to let Bonner students develop their relationships,
- Personal and cultural awareness (activities for self-reflection on personal identity and diverse communities)
- Orientation to campus structure (key school staff, program mission/philosophy, achievements, goals for the future, etc.)
- Orientation to surrounding community (community partner introduction, demographics, assets, or specific prevalent issues facing your community)
- Opportunities for personal reflection (personal goals and aspirations to commit to)
- College transition support (especially crucial for first-year Bonner scholars — tours of campus, administration introductions, workshops or skill-training in time management, and study skills)

Orientation Examples:

- Community Building: **University of Rutgers @ Camden** - Cards Promoting Humanity Activity, Cards Promoting Humanity (tailored to their Bonner Program and Campus), Get-To-Know-You Welcome Activities (Find Someone and Preferences game), **Maryville College** - Meal times together, Bowling Night, **Berry College** - Icebreakers, Meal Teams, Game Night, Pool Party, **Siena College** - Icebreakers and Various Social Activities
 - Bonner Big-Picture & Expectations: **Maryville College** - Logistics, Handbook Rules, BWBRS training, **Berry College** - Program Overview with Reflection and creative activity around the common commitments, **Siena College** - "Program Time" Sessions for different levels, **Show Bonner History video on www.bonner.org**
 - Get to know the College & Community: **University of Rutgers @ Camden** - Annual Review of Service Partners, **Maryville College** - Bike Tour of Community, Service Projects, **Berry College** - Town Scavenger Hunt, Campus Tour, Community Partners Tour & Brunch, **Siena College** - Service Projects & free time around the town
 - Get to Know Self & Others: **University of Rutgers @ Camden** - "What's Your Passion?" and Goal-setting activity, **Maryville College** - Leadership compass, **Berry College** - River Stories / Identity Circles, **Siena College** - Reflection Sessions, other training workshops

COLLABORATING ON IDEAS!

Things to be Mindful of:

- Logistical details of length and time — needs to be long enough to cover essential content
- Fiscal constraints — check what your budget is prior to planning orientation and be sure that all elements planned are feasible
- Travel and housing necessities if orientation will not be on campus
- Food!!! (plan out meals, snacks, etc.)
