PROGRAM COMPONENTS

- A work-study stipend for about 120 hours each semester
- Community Service placement in an area of interest
- Weekly leadership training
- Opportunity to attend regional and national conferences
- Opportunity to increase service responsibility in future years
- Opportunity to mentor as upperclass students

ELIGIBILITY & SELECTION

- Be eligible for Federal Work study
 - Be willing to make a commitment to fulfill all program components
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- Complete application & essay
 - Review by Bonner Selection Committee
 - Notification by Bonner Director
