

About the Bonner Leader Program

Bonner is a national, four-year, and cohort-based program focused on community service. Students serve at a non-profit agency for 9 hours/week and attend weekly training meetings for 2 hours/week.

Steps to Apply

1. Interested students submit an Undergraduate Application and receive acceptance into The University of Tampa.
2. Accepted students submit the UT Bonner Leader application (below). Only first-year positions are available.
3. Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) online at www.fafsa.gov to determine eligibility to receive Federal Work Study.
4. After applications are reviewed, finalists will be invited for a Zoom interview.
