


2,700 Organizations


As of 2021, 2,700 organizations provided food to low-income Pennsylvania residents

Produce Express

The Produce Express program delivers a truckload of food for up to 200 struggling families in need where traditional food pantries are not available.

Backpack Program

This program provides children with nutritious, child-friendly food when other resources, such as school lunches and after-school meals or snacks, are not available.


School Pantry Program

Senior Box Program


To help alleviate the stress of not knowing where a next meal may come from, the U.S.D.A. provides food items for distribution to low-income seniors through the Commodity Supplemental Food Program or CSFP.

Milk Initiative

As a member of Feeding Pennsylvania, Second Harvest has partnered with agricultural partners and business leaders to make milk accessible to the hungry.

Pasta and Sauce


Canned tomato, meat and alfredo sauce; spaghetti, elbow, and penne pasta; mac and cheese

Parkhurst's Excess Food

- Parkhurst throws away/wastes significant amounts of food daily.
- This excess amount of food could be donated as it has been in previous years,

Second Harvest Food Bank

- SHFB is the largest nonprofit food distribution organization in northwest PA.
- SHFB solicits, receives, inventories, stores and distributes millions of grocery products each year.

Meadville Community Food Kitchen

 The soup kitchen relies on donations of food and money to serve community members.

Meadville Residents

- Many Meadville residents rely on food distribution programs.
- Because of this, donating excess food from Parkhurst to present a new and reliable fresh food resource.
